## **REPORT OF THE**

# **Two-Day National Workshop on "Plant Diversity of NE India with** special reference to Mizoram"

The Two-Day National Workshop on "*Plant Diversity of NE India with special reference to Mizoram*" organized by Department of Botany, Department of Life Sciences, PUC, in collaboration with GZRSC, Aizawl was held from 23<sup>rd</sup>-24<sup>th</sup> May, 2023 at Seminar Hall, PUC.

# <u>DAY 1</u>:

## Inauguration (10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.)

The inaugural programme was chaired by Prof. H. Lalruatsanga, Convenor, National Workshop cum HoD, Department of Botany, PUC. The chairperson started the event with a warm welcome speech. This was followed by the Inaugural Address which was delivered by Mr. H.S. Lalsangpuia, Vice Principal, PUC. With his profound wisdom and scholarly insights, he ignited the participants' minds, emphasizing on the importance of conservation of plant diversity especially for Mizoram, NE Indian region.

The Keynote Address was delivered by Dr.Tawnenga, Former Pricipal, PUC, and currently the Principal of Mizoram Christian College, Aizawl. #### **First Technical session**:

During the first session, Dr. Krishna Upadhaya, Associate Professor, Basic Sciences and Social Sciences Department, NEHU talked on "*Plant diversity in community forests of Northeast India and their conservation*". He explained the status of plants in and around Meghalaya region, their diversity and conservation measures. The session proved to be highly engaging and informative for the participants.

# Second Technical session:

Second Technical session was started at 2:00 p.m. The session was chaired by Mrs.Zodinpuii, HoD, Department of Botany, GZRSC, Aizawl and Dr.BendangchuchangLongchar, Assistant Professor, Department of Life Sciences, PUC. In this session, Dr. H.S. Thapa, Former HOD, Department of Botany, PUC delivered a scintillating lecture on "*Field and herbarium technique; Identifying characters of few families of flowering plants commonly found in*
