A VISIT TO THE LIBRARY

AIZAWL 18th July, 2023: It was a little over 3p.m when our teachers from the department of Sociology, Miss Laldinpuii and Sir Peka took us, the 1st Semester students of the department of Sociology for a visit to the library, the library of our prestigious college Pachhunga University College. We were first headed to the administrative block where we were told what we would be doing and the teachers explained to us the things that were done in the Administrative block. We then followed the teachers down to the library. As the campus of the college is vast and huge, the library was a little away from our department room, from our block. Not so surprisingly, the library was huge inside, it was clean and had a lot of books, there were clean shelves where we could keep our bags, we were to have an orientation there. We were informed that the library was automated and that there were two systems. We were told that the systems and our IDcard were all linked. On the 2nd floor, there were glass cupboards, and inside it, there

were special collections which were for preference but not for borrowing. Everything was well organised in the library, there were well arranged tables and chairs and again, there was a well carried out system of circulation of books section as well. The security system in the library was also very impressive, there were a few CCTV cameras. We were warned and advised not to lend our library cards to anyone else.
