## MIZORAM UNIVERSITY DECLARES UG ODD SEMESTER RESULTS

# PUC continues to retain its standing as a leading college

**January, 2026 :** Mizoram University has declared the Under Graduate Odd Semester (I, III and V) examination results on January 20. With the announcement of the results, Pachhunga University College (PUC) has once again reaffirmed its position as one of the leading colleges in academic performance.

In the Bachelor of Arts (BA) programme under the National Education Policy (NEP), a total of 14,127 regular and repeater candidates were registered across the I, III and V semesters. Of these, 13,899 students appeared for the examinations, and 10,127 students successfully passed, recording an overall pass percentage of 72.86 per cent.

Among the 25 colleges in the Arts stream, the Higher and Technical Institute of Mizoram (HATIM) emerged as the top-performing institution, achieving a pass percentage of 92.70 across all three semesters. Pachhunga University College secured the second position with 92.53 per cent, while Mizoram Christian College (MCC) stood third with a pass percentage of 89.53. In terms of student participation, 178 candidates appeared from HATIM, 239 from MCC, and a significantly higher number of 1,657 candidates from PUC.

In the Science stream, a total of 1,978 candidates were registered, out of which 1,957 appeared for the examination. Among them, 1,467 students passed, resulting in an overall pass percentage of 74.96 per cent.

In aggregate performance in the Science stream, Pachhunga University College (PUC) emerged as the top-performing institution with a pass percentage of 84.41. Government Champhai College secured the second position

## Editorial

### January 2026 -A Month of Academic and Cultural Engagement

January 2026 marked an eventful beginning to the academic year at Pachhunga University College. The reopening of the college on 16<sup>th</sup> January, welcomed back students to the Campus with renewed enthusiasm and purpose. The day started with classes which was followed by Departmental Faculty Meeting and later, Faculty Meeting was held at the Seminar Hall. On this occasion the Principal, Professor H. Lalthanzara addressed the gathering, commending the collective efforts of the faculty in fostering academic excellence and inspiring the college community to strive for holistic growth. A very informative power point presentation was made by Professor Lalhriatzula regarding CAS and Samarth Entry.

Results of the Odd Semester Examinations, November-December 2025 was declared by the Mizoram University on the 20<sup>th</sup> of January, setting the academic tone for the new term. The overall results of the College (Arts, Science, Commerce and Management) are as follows: First Semester: No. of students appeared-1060; No of students pass-899; No of students fail-161; pass percentage -85.03. Third Semester: No of students appeared-778; No of students pass-718; no of students fail-60; pass percentage 92.14. Fifth Semester; No of students appeared-775; No of students pass-717; no of students fail-58; pass percentage 92.18.

The month featured the lively K-Pop event of dance competition on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of January, in collaboration with MGH Korea following the inauguration of the Korean Language Centre the previous month, the Japanese Language Centre having been inaugurated around the same time. This aptly reflects the institution's commitment to global cultural engagement.

On 27<sup>th</sup> January, a total of 16 students were selected for the "Earn while Learn" for the period-27<sup>th</sup> January 2026 to 30<sup>th</sup> April 2026. This program has been initiated to help students with their financial burden. They will earn a sum of ₹80/- per hour.

Strengthening academic collaboration, the Department of Geology & Geophysics, PUC signed an MoU with the Department of Geology, Government of Mizoram, on the 29<sup>th</sup> January 2026. The parties to the signatory were Principal, PUC Prof.H Lalthanzara, and Pu J. Chamliana, Director, Geology and Mining on behalf of their respective departments. The MoU includes collaboration of research projects, exchange of knowledge, capacity building and so forth.

The faculties and research scholars of the Department of Geology paid a geological visit/preliminary study of our adopted village, Sailam on the 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> January for the fulfillment of their ongoing project on "Geological, Geotechnical and Geophysical investigation of Sailam Village" under the initiative of Dr H. Lawmkima, Associate Professor, Project P.I.

On 29<sup>th</sup> January, the Department of Biotechnology, in collaboration with NSS, PUC and funded by ICAR-NBAIM (National Bureau of Agriculturally Important Microorganisms) organized a seminar on "Empowering Mizoram's Farmers with Sustainable Farming Skills", underscoring the college's dedication to community-oriented initiatives.

The month concluded with the observance of India's Republic Day by the departments of Public Administration, Political Science, Sociology and History, reaffirming the values of civic responsibility and constitutional awareness.

## Campus Review Released



**December 5:** PUC Campus Review, the monthly newsletter of Pachhunga University College, was released by the Principal, Prof. H. Lalthanzara, at the Principal's Conference Hall.

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In the Commerce stream, a total of 1,023 candidates were registered, out of which 1,016 appeared for the examination. Among them, 862 students passed, resulting in an overall pass percentage of 84.84 per cent.

In Commerce, Helen Lowry College emerged as the top-performing institution with a pass percentage of 98.25. It was followed by the Higher and Technical Institute of Mizoram (HATIM) in second place with 93.26 per cent, while Mizoram Christian College (MCC) secured the third position with 93.12 per cent. Pachhunga University College (PUC) stood fifth with a pass percentage of 86.95. In terms of student participation, 39 candidates appeared from Helen Lowry College, 90 from HATIM, 67 from MCC, and 191 from PUC.

The Management stream is offered by only three colleges in Mizoram. In this stream, Pachhunga University College (PUC) topped the list with a pass percentage of 90.78, followed by Government J. Thankima College in second place with 88.49 per cent. Mizoram Christian College (MCC) stood third with a pass percentage of 74.59.

- Dr. Margaret Zirsangliani Khiangte, Associate Professor, Department of Economics, and Vice Principal of the College, has published a research paper entitled “*The Cooperative Movement in Mizoram: A Historical Analysis (1904–2008)*” in the *International Journal for Multidisciplinary Research*, an international open-access peer-reviewed journal (Impact Factor: 9.24; E-ISSN: 2582-2160), in October 2025.
- Faculty members of the Department of Physics—Professor Lalhriat Zuala, Professor Shivraj Gurung, and Assistant Professor Dr. Lalrinthara Pachuau—have co-authored a research article entitled “*A DFT Study on the Structural, Electronic, Optical and Mechanical Properties of Lead-Free Perovskites  $Rb_2YAuX_6$  ( $X = F, Cl, Br, I$ ) for Solar Cell Applications.*” The article was published in the *Journal of Electronic Materials*, a peer-reviewed journal published by Springer Science+Business Media on behalf of the IEEE Electron Devices Society and The Minerals, Metals & Materials Society (TMS). The journal is indexed in SCOPUS and the Science Citation Index (SCI) and has an Impact Factor of 2.5.
- Faculty members of the Department of Physics—Professor Lalhriat Zuala, Professor Shivraj Gurung, and Assistant Professors Dr. Lalrinthara Pachuau and Dr. Lalmuanpuia Vanchhawng—have co-authored a research article entitled “*Group-I Lead Oxide  $X_2PbO_3$  ( $X = Li, Na, K, Rb$  and  $Cs$ ) Glass-like Materials for Energy Applications: A Hybrid-DFT Study.*” The article was published in *RSC Advances*, a peer-reviewed journal of the Royal Society of Chemistry, which is indexed in SCOPUS and the Science Citation Index (SCI) and has an Impact Factor of 4.6.
- Dr. Saurav Kumar, Assistant Professor in the Department of Geography, has co-authored three research articles in reputed journals. Two articles published in *Discover Sustainability* (Scopus and Web of Science–ESCI indexed, Springer Nature) are titled “*Changing Agroclimatic Zones and Cropping Patterns in the Garhwal Himalaya with Reference to Major Drivers, Implications and Mitigation Measures*” and “*Out-migration from the Indian Himalayan Region (IHR) with Drivers, Patterns and Policy Implications for Sustainable Mountain Development.*” He has also co-authored “*Assessing the Effectiveness of Beneficiary Schemes in Enhancing Higher Education among the Scheduled Castes: A Case Study of Jalpaiguri District, West Bengal,*” published in *Transactions*, a Scopus-indexed journal of the Institute of Indian Geographers.

## STUDY TOURS CONDUCTED



The Department of Political Science organised a study tour to Kolkata for final-year students. During the tour, students and faculty members donated 17 units of blood to a 10-year-old girl who is undergoing treatment for blood cancer at Tata Medical Centre, Kolkata.

Students of the Department of Commerce visited the Industrial Park in Guwahati and undertook an industrial visit to a polymer-based industry in January 2026. As part of their study tour, the students also visited Kaziranga National Park for an educational excursion.

The Department of Botany organised a study tour to Kolkata from 9 to 14 January 2026. During the tour, the students visited the Acharya Jagdish Chandra Bose Indian Botanic Garden, including the nursery, cactus section, Prain Lake, and the famous banyan tree, one of the largest in the world by canopy spread. They also visited the Victoria Memorial and the Indian Museum.

The Department of English conducted a study tour to Sikkim, while the Department of Management organised a study tour to Kolkata, where the students visited the Birla Industrial and Technology Museum on 8 January 2026.
