ADMINISTRATIVE BLOCK

Pachhunga University College is a constituent College of Mizoram University. The college was established on 15 August 1958 as 'Aijal College' to become the first higher educational institution in Mizoram. It was founded and managed by a group of Mizo elders among which Mr. Pachhunga, a leading entrepreneur of the day, was the major benefactor, and after his demise the college was renamed Pachhunga Memorial College.

The college was provincialised by the Assam Government in 1965 and the college became Pachhunga Memorial Government College (PMG). The college was renamed Pachhunga College in 1977. On 19 April 1979, the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) adopted and upgraded it as its only constituent college. The college eventually received its fourth name, Pachhunga University College (PUC). With the establishment of Mizoram University, the entire management was handed over to the new university in July, 2001.

The welfare of the students is the number one priority of the college. The college is also the leader among all Mizoram colleges in terms of research activities and publications. The college also organizes seminars / workshops / conferences / trainings at various levels International / National / State levels. The college offers undergraduate courses in 22 subject areas of Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. The academic programme is a choice based credit system and includes continuous assessment, periodic class tests, seminars, assignments, remedial courses, field studies etc. The college also promotes student exposure through study tours inside and outside the State. Post-graduate courses have been started in 2018 and became the first and only PG College in the state. Four PG courses viz. Life Sciences, Mizo, Philosophy and Geo-Physics are being offered.

One of the distinctive features of the college is its unique setting with a sprawling 760 acres campus. Its lush-green vegetation, the result of 60 years of nurturing the campus and wide-open space with luxuriant natural vegetation provides an excellent atmosphere of learning. The college is well equipped with IT facility. All class rooms are provided with projectors and all departments are linked with internet.

In its strive towards excellence, the college is now recognized at the national level and has been awarded A+ grade by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The College has been granted UGC 'College with Potential for Excellence' Scheme, the scheme awarded to few institutions over the country, which has the potential to reach world class standard. The college is also ISO 9001:2015 certified since 2018. The institution has also been identified as a potential 'Mentor Institution' to help the NAAC aspiring institutions. It is a Star College under the DBT Scheme. The college has PG classes in the departments of Philosophy, Mizo and Life Science. It also received 'Indira Gandhi NSS Awards' in 2016 for its outstanding contribution to the service of the community at various levels. The college has also secured the title of 'Overall Champion' in the MZU Sports meet consecutively for five years in 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021. Thus, the MZU Championship Trophy now belongs to PUC.

1. BUILDING COMPLEX

The college complex comprises of the Administrative Building, four Arts Blocks, Science Block, Life Science Block, Physical Science Block, Sports Infrastructure Training Facility (UGC), Seminar Hall, Library, two Boys' Hostel, two Girls' Hostel, Playground, Multipurpose Sports complex and staff quarters. A New Academic Cluster Block is under construction.

2. LIBRARY

The college library has 53888 books. A wide range of encyclopedias and advanced books of knowledge provide a ready reference to Library users. The library at present subscribes to 42 journals and online journals (Inflibnet). All of the books are automated using SOL2.0 from INFLIBNET.

3. LABORATORIES

Psychology, Geography and all the nine science departments have functional laboratories. The laboratories are being equipped with sophisticated instruments to enable the students to carry out practical not only at the honours level but even at the advanced level of experimental work. All practical facilities have been upgraded through Star College Scheme and Biotechnology Hub of Department of Biotechnology, Government of India. Major renovation of all practical laboratories is also done through the same scheme. A fully functioning Research Center has also recently been launched.

4. TRANSPORTATION

Four buses provide transportation to the students and teachers to and from the college at regular intervals. The college transportation is available to all members of the College.

5. TUTOR WARD SYSTEM

Each department divides students into small groups and each group is assigned to a teacher. The teacher-in-charge keeps in touch with students of his / her group, helps and guides them in their studies, personal problems, etc., through periodic meetings.

6. PLAYGROUND

The College has a playground which was inaugurated in 2009. The playground not only caters to the need of the college but also to the community at large.

7. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

A Student Internet Resource Centre was inaugurated in 2009. The centre is open for the students on all working days. It provides access to the Internet and caters to every need of the students in the field of information technology. The college also has a functional networking system with students' database system.

8. HOSTEL

Two Boys' Hostels with seating capacities of 176 students and two Girls' Hostels with seating capacities of 180 students cater to the residential needs of out-station students. Hostel seats are allotted on priority basis to students from rural villages. A new 25 seater Girls Hostel is under construction.

9. MEDICAL FACILITY

Qualified Doctors and Nurses from MZU are available for consultation at the College once every Week. They can be consulted free of cost by all the staff and students of the College.

10. CAREER GUIDANCE & COUNSELLING

The College provides regular counselling in different fields including career guidance, spiritual guidance and mental health on a regular basis throughout the year.

11. RESEARCH FACILITIES

The College also promotes research and developments. A separate Research and Instrumentation Centre was established in 2017. There are as many as 31 research projects in various departments. The college also has a Biotechnology training Centre called 'Biotechnology Hub' sponsored by the Department of Biotechnology, New Delhi. Zoology, Geology, Botany, Physics, Chemistry and Biotechnology departments has established a national level standard research laboratory. Ph.D. course has been started in Life Sciences department since 2020. Many teachers are supervising research scholars in collaboration with parent university i.e. MZU.

12. UGC COMMUNITY COLLEGE SCHEME

The College received a grant from UGC to conduct Community College Scheme. Under this scheme the college offers

1. **Certificate course in House Keeping**
Duration of the course : 6 months
2. **Certificate course in Vermitechnology.**
Duration of the course : 6 months
3. **Diploma in Mizo Handicraft and Technology Education.**
Duration of the course : 6 months.
4. **Certificate course in Repair and Maintenance of UPS, Inverter and Power supply.**
Duration of the course : 6 months.
Eligibility : 12 Pass (Any stream)



13. IGNOU:

IGNOU Study centre was established in the year 2008 to cater the needs of the students who cannot afford regular studies but who want to pursue higher studies particularly in science subjects. It is the only IGNOU centre in Mizoram offering science stream. The first admissions were opened in January 2008. Every year, two sessions are opened in the months of June and December, students can opt for either of the two sessions. Courses opened are Master Degree Programme, Certificate Programme, Diploma Programme, Bachelor Degree Programme and Bachelor Preparatory Programme.

14. Village Adoption:

Village Adoption is an integral part of college activities since 2012 with the intention of service to the community through dissemination of knowledge and self sacrifice. The aim of adoption of village is to give new ideas of development to the villages which would improve their living conditions. The college renders services in terms of research and awareness to health, environment, improvement of agricultural practices, disaster management etc.

The College has so far adopted three villages, Phulpui village (2012-15), Lungleng village (2016-18), Dulte village (2019-2021) and Khawrihnmim (2021-on going).

15. Earn While Learn Scheme:

This Scheme is introduced to help students who come from low income group to earn extra income. They work five hours a week after classes in cleaning the campus area, class room, library etc.

16. DBT Star College and DBT-BUILDER:

The college has been selected as a Star College under DBT for the session 2019-2022 and “DBT-Boost to University Interdisciplinary Life Science Departments for Education and Research (DBT-BUILDER)” for a period of 5 years at a total cost of ₹ 2,68,50,120.00 has been sanctioned.

17. Add-on Courses:

A. Literary Appreciation and Basic Theory In English: Literary Appreciation Classes are conducted on Odd semester to the fifth semester students. Varying genres of literature is touched upon in this class along with literary concepts and terms. Basic theory classes are given during Even semesters to the sixth semester students. It introduces the students to the vital theories of literature that will better their proficiency, familiarising them with critical literary theories and concepts and equipping them for higher learning.

B. Language Laboratory: The purpose of the course is to introduce a platform to conduct language learning activities with simple exercises with supplemental content where in the students learn self confidence, proper pronunciation and improve expression skills.

C. Certificate in Mizo Cultural Studies and Performing Arts: This course is conducted by the College with the aim to preserve and further develop the Mizo Culture, heritage and tradition.

1. ADMISSION : UNDER GRADUATE

1.1 ADMISSION PERIOD: Admission shall be opened immediately after the publication of HSSLC results of Mizoram Board of School Education. Admission process shall be done online through admission link provided in the college website <https://pucollege.edu.in>. Candidates shall fill up the online admission form. Candidates who are offered admission shall produce original and attested copies of HSLC and HSSLC mark sheets and one passport size photograph at the time of admission.

1.2 The cut off marks for eligible candidates will be 55% aggregate in HSSLC.

1.3 Selection of candidates in Arts and Commerce will be on purely merit basis as per the following criteria.

- (a) 80% weightage will be given to marks obtained in HSSLC (total marks obtained divided by full mark x 80)
- (b) 20% weightage will be given to marks obtained in HSLC (total marks obtained divided by full mark x 20)
- (c) Total Score = (a) + (b)

1.4 Direct admission will be given in Arts and Commerce, but not in Science and BBA.

1.5. For direct admission

- (i) **In Arts:** Candidates who have passed Class 12 (Arts) in first division, securing 80% weightage or above as per criteria in point 1.3
- (ii) **In Commerce:** Candidates having Mathematics subject in Class 12 and scoring 65% or above in Class 12 (Commerce) and obtaining at least 60% both in Business Studies and Accountancy papers. Candidates with Mathematics in Class 12 will be given preference for admission in Commerce.

1.6 For BBA - Written test, personal interview and group discussion will be conducted.

- (a) Admission forms are available at the official website.
- (b) Date of written test, personal interview and group discussion will be intimated in the College website.
- (c) Test syllabus: General English, Quantitative Aptitude and Reasoning Ability, Business Studies, Simple Arithmetic

1.7 For Science, selection will be based on the following criteria:

- (a) Entrance Test (Class 12 standard) – 50% weightage will be given to marks obtained in the entrance test.
- (b) HSSLC performance – 40% weightage (total marks obtained divided by full mark x 40).
- (c) HSLC performance – 10% weightage (total marks obtained divided by full mark x 10).
- (d) Total score = (a)+(b)+(c)
- (e) Entrance test will be conducted through online mode.

1.8 RESERVATION OF SEATS: Reservation will be given to the following

- (a) Differently abled (previously PWD) candidates (Documentary proof to be attached)
- (b) Sports/National level talented candidates
- (c) For the under privileged sections viz. ST, SC, OBC and EWS
- (d) Children of employees of Pachhunga University College and Mizoram University

(Certificate of employment should be issued from the office of Registrar, MZU or Principal, PUC)

Candidates fulfilling the reservation criteria must have at least 40% marks in Class 12 and shall appear for personal interview/ physical test (for sports quota).

1.10 APPLYING FOR MORE THAN ONE SUBJECT:

Students who wish to apply for admission in more than one subjects, will have an option of choosing three subjects indicating their preferences as first choice, second choice and third choice in the online application.

2. ON EVALUATION

2.1 The system of evaluation is based on Continuous Assessment (CA) and end semester examinations (ESE).

2.2 Continuous Assessment (CA) of I Semester to IV Semester will be centrally conducted by the Exam Committee of the college through the department concerned.

2.3 Continuous Assessment (CA) of V Semester & VI Semester will be conducted by the department concerned.

2.4 CA will consist of 25 marks.

(A) SUBJECT WITHOUT PRACTICAL

(a) First CAT : 12 Marks

(b) Second CAT : 12 Marks

(c) Assignment : 8 Marks

(d) Attendance : 5 Marks

Total marks = (Average of 1st CAT and 2nd CAT) + Assignment + Attendance

(B) SUBJECT WITH PRACTICAL

(a) First CAT : 12 Marks

(b) Second CAT : 12 Marks

(c) Assignment : 8 Marks

(d) Attendance : 5 Marks

Total marks = (Average of 1st CAT and 2nd CAT) + Assignment + Attendance

2.5 Distribution of marks: For written test in CA, the full mark will be 40 and duration of the test will be 1hour 30minutes (The full mark of 40 will be converted into total marks out of 12). Question pattern and distribution of marks will be as follows:

2.6 Retest: The Principal in consultation with the department concerned, can grant special permission for a retest.

2.7 Submission of marks: The CA marks in whole number will be submitted by each department to the Principal before the commencement of ESE of that semester. The marks will be moderated by the Moderation Board and then submitted to the University.

2.8 Practical Examinations: All the practical exams (CA&End Semester) will be conducted by the concerned Department before the commencement of End Semester Exam (Theory)

2.9 Candidates are not allowed to bring mobile phones, digital diary and electronic devices inside the Examination Room.

3. ON ATTENDANCE

3.1 A student is eligible to write the End Semester Exam only if the student has a minimum attendance of 75% in aggregate in all the subjects.

3.2 Attendance will be calculated by taking the average of the attendance percentage of all the months in a semester. The final attendance shall be the total of the average of attendance in all subjects offered to the student.

3.3 Students are not entitled to any leave. In case of emergency and unavoidable circumstances, an application supported by relevant documents should be submitted to the Head of Department concerned.

3.4 Students are entitled to check their attendance with the respective teachers and clear their doubts, if any. No complaint or request for attendance will be entertained after compilation of final attendance.

3.5 Students representing the college, state and nation in sports and co-curricular activities may be given appropriate attendance for the period of their engagement.

INTRODUCTION: Pachhunga University college is committed to maintaining equality, fairness, and healthy environment for higher education. It accommodates a diverse community and sexes, and aims to provide inclusiveness, harmony and personal development by upholding the Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles and Fundamental Duties of India. This Code is ratified for the purposes of personal responsibility, peer accountability, safety, and social consciousness, among the students by the HOD committee.

1. RAGGING : The University Grant Commission (UGC Regulation on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institution) 2009 defines ragging as, “Any act of Physical or mental abuse(Including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.” Ragging in campus is punishable by law and possible penalties range from

- (1) cancellation of enrolment,
- (2) debaring from examinations,
- (3) suspension for period of 1 to 4 semesters,
- (4) expulsion,
- (5) fine Ranging from Rs 25000 up to 1 lakh.

2. SEXUAL HARASSMENT: UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of sexual Harassment of women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institution) Regulation, 2015 defines “sexual harassment” as “An unwanted conduct with sexual undertones if it occurs or which is persistent and which demeans, humiliates or creates a hostile and intimidating environment or is calculated to induce submission by actual or threatened adverse consequences and includes any one or more or all of the following unwelcome acts or behaviour (Whether directly or by implication) namely:

- (a) any unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature;
- (b) demand or request for sexual favours;
- (c) making sexually coloured remarks
- (d) physical contact and advances or
- (e) Showing pornography

Sexual harassment in the college is a legal crime and the penalty for a perpetrator student is expulsion.

3. ATTENDANCE: UGC (Minimum Standards of Instruction for the Grant of the First Degree Through Formal Education) Regulations, 2003 imposes a minimum of 75% attendance out of the total number of classes students should attend in all subjects for eligibility to appear in the university examinations. Students deficit in attendance, i.e. <75% are barred from appearing in the end semester examinations. CCA attendance is recorded separately; absence in CCA will be fined with Rs 100 every time.

4. CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT (CA): There are three continuous assessments in a semester (First and second written tests and seminar/assignment/project/class test) to which all students must compulsorily

appear. If a student fails to appear in any of the test, he/she will have to meet the Principal and furnish an explanation. Under special conditions, the Principal in consultation with the department concerned can grant special permission for retest, if necessary.

5. SMOKING, MISUSE OF ALCOHOL AND NARCOTICS/INTOXICANTS: The college strictly prohibits smoking, drinking liquor and indulgence in any intoxicants within the college campus. Violation shall bear penalties such as:

(a) A fine of Rs 200 (For every offence) for smoking;

(b) A fine of Rs 200 for drinking liquor or use of intoxicants as the first offence; second offence leads to expulsion.

6. MALPRACTICE IN EXAMS: Malpractice in exams includes any sort of cheating, copying from notes or other students, use of illegal materials or gadgets, disrupting others and practice of any unfair mean. Students indulging in such malpractices shall be punished as per the Mizoram University Examinations Rules and Regulations. Punishment can result up to direct expulsion.

7. CLEANLINESS: The college strives to sustain hygienic and sanitary campus. There should not be littering in the college campus. Students should discard wastes in the proper dustbin provided. Toilets should be cleaned after use. Spitting in the classrooms, pavements, corridors and Toilet is strictly prohibited. Offenders are liable to a fine of Rs 100. Teachers, Administrative officers and security staff can impose the fine.

8. MOBILE PHONES: Use of mobile phones and related electronic gadget is restricted in the classroom during class hours and examinations. If a student is found violating this restriction his/her mobile phone/ device will be confiscated. Confiscated phones can be claimed from the Principal only after seven days upon payment of Rs 200 as a fine.

9. LEAVE OF ABSENCE: Students are not entitled for personal leave of absence from the classes. However, in case of emergencies and unavoidable circumstances, an application supported by relevant documents (Sickness-doctor's letter; death related – funeral service Program) should be submitted to the Head of the department or teacher concerned, immediately on the first day of resuming classes. No leave application should be entertained or considered if it is submitted after a lapse of even just one day.

10. SOCIAL MEDIA AND CYBER CRIME: Social Media such as Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp, Blogs Internet Forum, etc. can be useful means of communication and sharing information. But students are advised to abstain from posting derogatory remarks about the college and its fraternity that could incite adverse consequences. If a student is found guilty of such activity, Disciplinary Committee of the college will take appropriate actions.

11. INTER- CLASS COMPETITION: The College does not allow any class to organize an inter-class competition of any kind not organised by the college or

without the approval of the heads of the department or the principal. Violation of this rule shall result in the following disciplinary actions:

- (a) Students of both parties will be subjected to college campus service.
- (b) Students of both parties will lose one-day attendance.

12. FUND - RAISER: Fund raising/ donations for service of the college and approved by the college authority is encouraged. However, Students individual or in groups, should not conduct fund raising activities on their own. Selling of any item, foodstuff, book and stationery material for educational purpose should be done only with a written authorisation of the principal.

13. VEHICLE PARKING AND TRAFFIC: Students should park their vehicles in the parking lot specified for them in an orderly fashion. Students should obey general traffics rules. Two wheelers can have only one pillion rider; and the driver should wear helmet. The speed limit inside the campus in 20 km/hr.

14. COLLEGE T-SHIRT: The College has an official T-shirt. It is compulsory for students to wear the T-shirts on Monday, and on special occasion notified by the college authority. An offence carries a fine of Rs. 100.

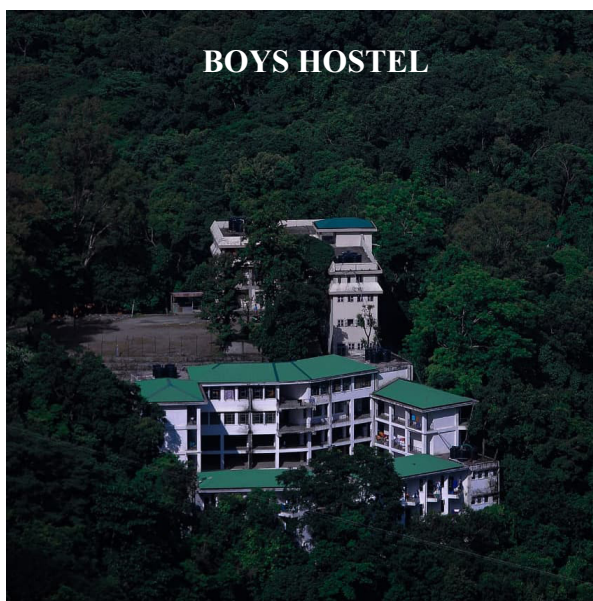
15. DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOUR: Disruptive behaviour or any conduct of a student that disturb teachers or other students to the point of disrupting teaching, disciplinary, or functions of the college on or off campus. The penalty is expulsion

16. PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL TOURNAMENT: Students are not allowed to participate in local tournaments of any form and manner during class hours. The College will not entertain any leave application furnished for such participation.

17. CLASS PICNIC: The College does not endorse class picnic. Any consequences will be the sole responsibility of the students, and not the college.

BOYS HOSTEL

1. Students' Union/Students' Council: Students' Union (Under Graduate) and Students' Council (Post Graduate) bodies actively functions as students' self government in which all the students are active members. The Students' Union provides a forum for practicing democratic governance of the student body. They work closely with the College authority to organize events like College Week, awareness-raising campaigns, etc.

2. National Service Scheme (NSS): The Pachhunga University College NSS Unit has a long tradition in the field of service to the community and the college neighborhood. Under the active supervisions of the Programme Officers the NSS provides opportunities for students to take part in various useful activities. This enables the students to develop their overall personality through community service. The college has received an award for the highest number of blood donated in a calendar year.

3. National Cadet Corps (NCC): The NCC Unit of the College is the first NCC Unit established in a college in Mizoram. It has produced many cadets, won a number of trophies and played prominent roles in all College functions. NCC aims to develop a sense of national spirit, discipline, patriotism and leadership qualities.

4. Adventure Club: The Adventure Club was formed by students and faculty for individuals who share a common interest in outdoor activities and excursions. Members of the club build friendships and exercise team skills by planning and participating in outdoor adventures, such as rock climbing, hiking, etc. The Adventure Club aims to take adventure to the students and instill in them the spirit of adventure and thus enable them to face the challenges of a new era.

5. Chess Club: The Chess Club's aim is to provide a friendly social atmosphere where students, staff members, and community members can gather outside of their usual interactions. Anyone who is interested is welcome and encouraged to join the club. Players of all skill levels and experiences, and anyone interested in learning more about the game or improving their skills is welcome to join.

6. Red Ribbon Club: The vulnerability of the youth is increasing day by day. To reduce the rapid spread of HIV/AIDS among the youths the Red Ribbon Club plays a very important role in combating this issue. The Red Ribbon Club makes use of Peer Educators for disseminating awareness among the students through various activities.

7. Cultural Club: The College has well established cultural clubs- Ainaawn cultural Club and Chhawkhleis cultural club. These clubs have received various awards in state level competitions.

8. Literature Club: The purpose of the club is to cater to the needs of the students and also to develop their interest in literature and language. The Literature Club of the college has been started with the sole purpose of encouraging the students to develop a taste for literature. The Club is involved in

a variety of activities aimed at building up the confidence and grooming the talents of students in facing various interpersonal activities and competitions.

9. Fitness Club: The college strives to achieve excellence in academic and co-curricular activities. The college has a fitness club located at the basement of Physical Science building. The fitness club and its equipments are sponsored by UGC(NERO) under "Indoor Sports Training facility".

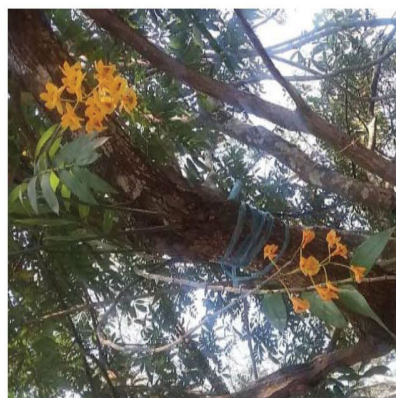
10. Innovation Club: The college also established innovations club to nurture critical thinking and innovations of faculty and students.

11. Finishing School: The Finishing School is organised every year for the outgoing VIth Semester students. This Finishing School is devised as a means for our young students to complete their education and to shape them into wholesome individuals. It is intended to instruct them in areas that are not covered within their academic curriculum.

12. Grad Dinner: The College organizes Graduation Dinner for final year students at the end of every academic year. This is usually a sell-out event and is a great way to end the term as well as the Degree Course in the College.

13. Eco Club: With the initiatives taken by the Environmental Science Department, the college has fully functioning Eco Club. The club regularly organizes environmental awareness at schools and community level and also takes steps towards ecological cleanliness within the campus.

14. Legal Literacy Club: The legal literacy Club not only boosts legal literacy but also helps in strengthening the capacity of the youth to effectively advocate for human rights and access to justice to vulnerable population. Certificates are awarded by the District Legal Services to students who actively participate in Legal Literacy Club.



Students support in the form of scholarship is available within the college. Some scholarship includes Post-Matric Tribal Scholarship in the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, GOI, UGC Ishan Uday Merit Scholarship for NE Students, Sitaram Jindal foundation scholarship for BPL Students, Departmental awards, etc.

(c) **Khawtinkhuma Proficiency Award** carrying cash prize of Rs. 10,000.00 with citation is given to Commerce student topper.

II. SPONSORSHIP:

(a) ZET Award: Meritorious students passing in distinction (Class12) in the Department of Physics will be sponsored by Zoram Educational Trust (ZET) @Rs1500p.m initially for the period of one semester which may be continued on the basis of their academic performance.

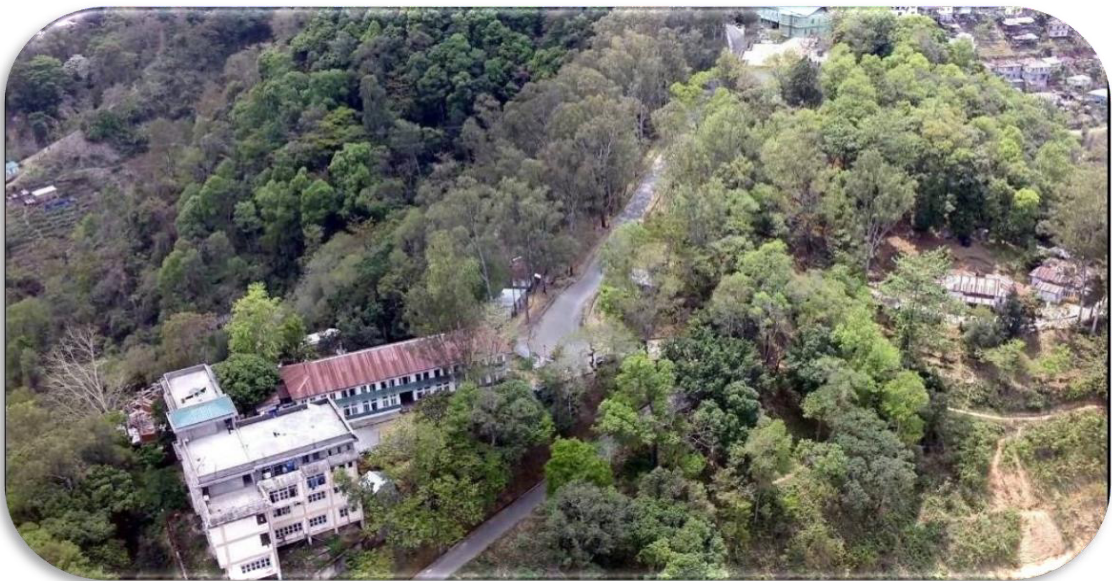

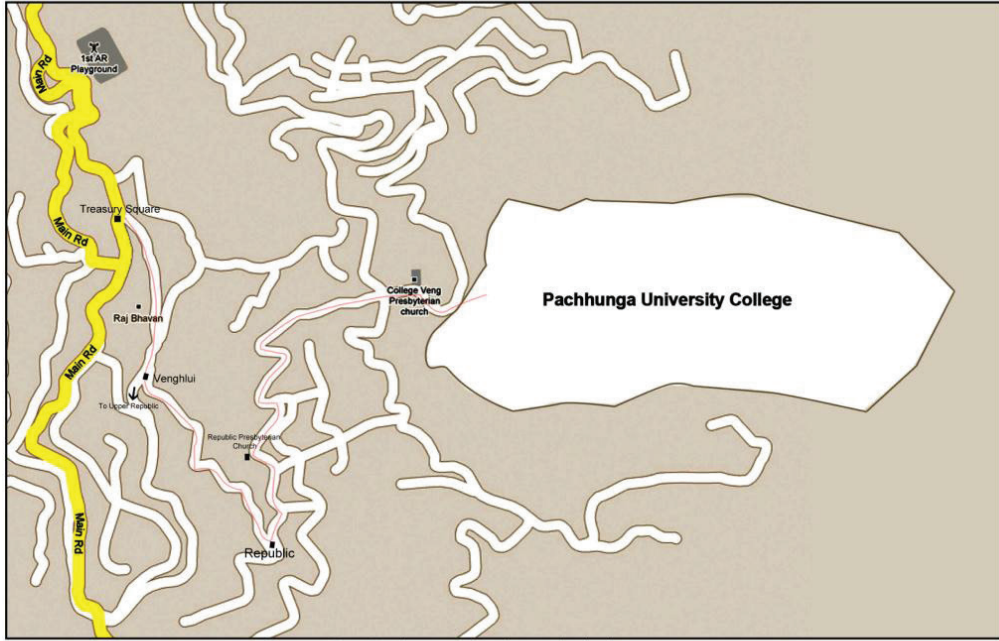

AERIAL VIEW OF PUC

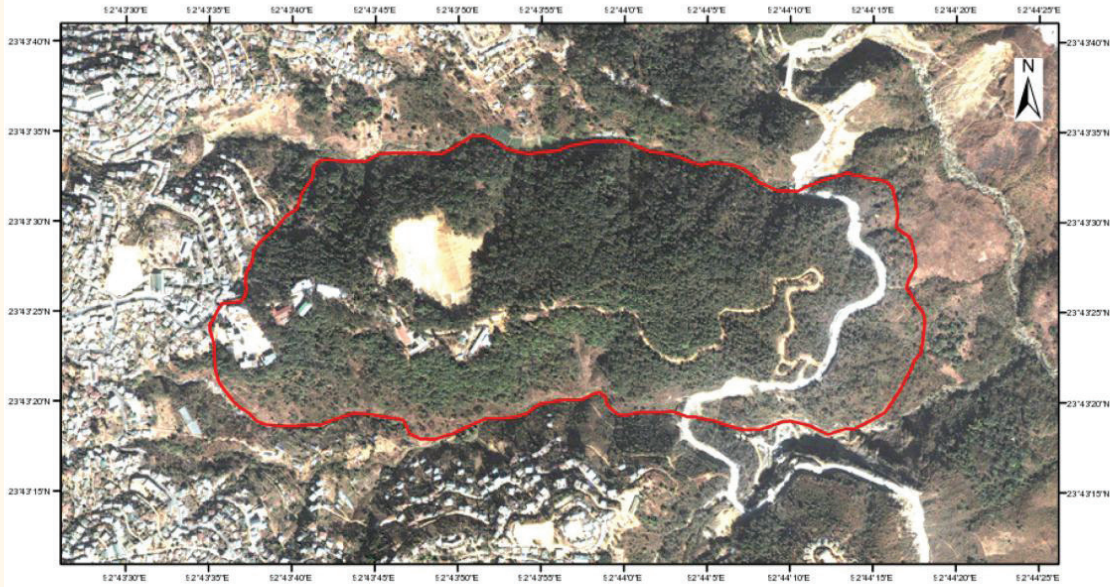

LOCATION MAP

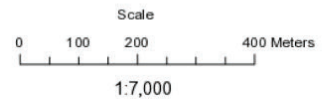
MAP OF PACHHUNGA UNIVERSITY COLLEGE CAMPUS, AIZAWL, MIZORAM
