Principal's Message

It is with a deep sense of gratitude that I welcome a new academic year 2026-2027 at Pachhunga University College. The college owes a great debt of gratitude towards its fraternity and its students who have worked diligently to maintain the quality of education and for the Physical and holistic development of the institution. With a NAAC Accreditation of A+ (CGPA 3.47 on 4 point scale) once again in 2023. In addition, the NIRF ranked the college 35th among colleges in India in 2024 and 49th in 2025. We have always believed in opening our doors to students eager to partake in the "Learning and Service" that has become our watchword through many years. With the introduction of the New Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) and the updated syllabus from last year onwards, we are eager to embrace the winds of change appearing in our educational system, while still upholding the traditional wisdom and accumulated knowledge of those that have shaped our educational system in the past.

I would like to use this opportunity to urge all our fresh applicants this year to keep in mind the motto of our university, Mizoram University, that 'Greater Deeds Remain'; yes, you have all achieved a lot in your young lives, but there is more knowledge to be gleaned more experiences to be lived, and more worlds to explore. About the College



Pi Chawngi, wife of Pu Pachhunga handed over a valuable gift of Rs. 50,000/- to Rev. Alwyn Roberts, Principal of Pachhunga College in 1962. The first College of Mizoram 'Aijal College' was renamed as 'Pachhunga Memorial College'.

Pachhunga University College (PUC), a premier public institute and the only constituent college of Mizoram University was founded on 15th August 1958 as Aijal College under Guwahati University. It became Aided College in 1961 under Assam government. In 1962, it was renamed as Pachhunga Memorial College (PMC). The college was provincialized by the Assam Government in 1965 and renamed "Pachhunga Memorial Government College" (PMGC). The college was affiliated to North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) in 1974. On 19th April 1979, the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) adopted and upgraded it as its only Constituent College. The college eventually received its fourth name, Pachhunga University College (PUC). With the establishment of Mizoram University and the entire College was handed over to the new university in July, 2001.

PUC was started with intermediate of arts courses only and was later expanded to a multi-disciplinary institution with bachelor degrees in Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. With the opening of master's degree courses in Arts and Science, it became the first postgraduate college and the only college that offers Ph. D course in Mizoram (i.e., PhD in Life Sciences and Philosophy).

It covers an area of 122 acres with about 70% forest cover and it is the oldest and largest college in Mizoram both in terms of enrolment and campus size. Its lush-green vegetation, the result of 65 years of nurturing the campus and wide-open space with luxuriant natural vegetation provides an excellent atmosphere of learning. The verdant forest of PUC is referred to as the "lung of the Aizawl city". In recognition of its conservation of forests, PUC received the Indira Priyadarshini Vrikshamitra Awards

in 1995 from the MoEF&CC, Govt of India. In 2022, PUC was awarded Nagar Van Yojana under NA&ED Board, MoEF&CC, Govt of India.

The college has also been bestowed with the Best College Award by ZRF. The college has received recognitions and awards such as DST (FIST) (2009 – 2013), DBT Start College (2013 & 2019), DBT Institutional Biotech Hub in 2011, which was upgraded to

Advanced Institutional Biotech Hub in 2017, and DBT- BUILDER in 2021. The college was also recognized by UGC as UGC-College with Potential for Excellence (CPE) in 2017-2021. PUC also received UGC Community College Scheme in 2014 and 2019, Mentor College under UGC Paramarsh Scheme 2018 and an ISO Certification in 2018 (ISO 9001:2015 and ISO 14001:2015). The college also received 'Indira Gandhi NSS Awards' in 2016 for its outstanding contribution to the service of the community.

National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) classified it as B grade in 2011, A+ grade in 2016 and again A+ with CGPA 3.47 out of 4 in 2023, the highest score in Mizoram. The National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) listed it among the best 150 colleges in India (rank band within 101-150) in 2020 and 2021, and in 2022 PUC secured the 45th rank. Pachhunga University College is ranked 34th in the NIRF Ranking – 2023 (College Category) and again 35th in 2024. Again in 49th ranked in 2025. The Green Audit conducted by the Green Mentors gave PUC a Platinum Ranking (2021-2023).

The College is blessed with a rich Central Library, nine academic buildings for UG courses and two academic buildings for PG courses, Sports Complex with football ground, Basketball, Volleyball, futsal and two badminton courts. The college also has separate Boys and Girls hostel with 230 and 180 capacities respectively and teaching and non-teaching staff quarters with eleven and eight

units each is also available. Two cafeterias, an administrative building, an Auditorium (2000 capacity), a well-equipped seminar hall and Golden Jubilee Hall (200 capacity each), Research and Instrumentation Centre (RIC), seven research centres with sophisticated instruments, language lab, computer lab, Internet resource centre (IRC), Zoological Museum, GIS Laboratory and Petrological Museum are some of the notable infrastructures within the campus. All classrooms are ICT enabled equipped with Interactive Flat Panel (IFP) and Wi-Fi internet facility. Separate students' welfare office, and a separate Boys and Girls recreation centres are also present.

The welfare of the students is the number one priority of the college. The college is also the leader among all Mizoram colleges in terms of research activities and publications. The college also organizes seminars / workshops/ conferences / trainings at various levels- International / National / State levels. The college offers undergraduate courses in 22 subject areas of Arts, Science, Commerce and Management. The academic programme is a choice-based credit system and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and includes continuous assessment, periodic class tests, seminars, assignments, remedial courses, projects, field studies etc. The college also promotes student exposure through study tours inside and outside the State. The college has also secured the title of 'Overall Champion' in the MZU Sports meet consecutively for six consecutive years (2016 – 2022).

Admission Criteria

COMMON UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE TEST (CUET)

- Common University Entrance Test (CUET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA)
- Candidate can obtain information for CUET through the website <https://cuet.samarth.ac.in>

OR

PUCET FOR ARTS, COMMERCE and MANAGEMENT STREAM

- Pachhunga University College Entrance Test (PUCET) conducted by PUC
- Admission through PUCET will be merit based (PUCET Score 70% and HSSLC marks 30%).
- PUCET will be based on class XI and XII Standard, which will be conducted during April, 2026 in MCQ format using OMR sheet.
- For language subjects (English & Mizo) and Philosophy it will be MCQ and Short Answers.
- PUCET + Interview for Management.

MERIT ADMISSION FOR B.Sc:

- Admission to Science Departments will be based on merit taking the best 5 subject score
- EVS applicants may use class XII Biology marks
- Statistics applicants may use class XII Mathematics marks as their concerned subjects.

OTHERS

- **Merit Admission:** Direct admission will be offered to the top 10 rank holders in the Arts, Commerce, and Science streams.



- **Subject Toppers:** Subject toppers seeking admission in the subject in which they topped will be offered direct admission.
- **Fee Concession:** The top 3 rank holders in each stream will be offered fee exemption (Terms and condition apply, subject to the Principal's approval).

SPONSORED SEATS :

- **Number of Sponsored Seats:** Each department will have two sponsored seats.
- Applicants for sponsored seats must have a minimum of 65% marks in HSSLC.
- Sponsored seat admission will be allotted on a first-come, first-served basis.
- The admission fee for sponsored seats will be 4.5 times the regular admission fee. Fees are non-refundable
- Fee for BBA sponsored seats will be 2.5 times the regular admission fee.
- The final selection for sponsored seats will be notified after the first admission list is published.

FREE INSURANCE

The College is providing free accidental insurance under Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana (PMSBY) to all students, which is having the coverage of Rs. 1 lakh to Rs. 2 lakhs.

SEAT RESERVATION POLICY

All seats quotas will be offered following the Government of India and institutional norms.

SPECIAL WEIGHTAGE

Children of regular employees of the Mizoram University and having certification from the Registrar (or Principal in case of PUC), will be given an additional 5% of their total PUCET score in the final merit.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR PUCET CANDIDATES

1. The registration fee and test fee, will be Rs. 300/- for one subject.
2. Students seeking admission in the first semester at Pachhunga University College are allowed to apply for two different Major subjects.
3. Students awaiting results must update their total marks obtained in HSSLC as soon as their results are declared. This can be done by signing into the admission portal with OTP sent to their registered phone number.
4. PUCET candidate must arrive at least one hour before the scheduled time of their entrance test without fail.
5. PUCET candidates must bring their HSSLC Board Examination Admit Card on the day of the entrance test. Without the HSSLC Admit Card, no candidate will be allowed to appear for the entrance test.
6. An OMR sheet will be used for the entrance test. Students should bring Black ball point pen. Students are, therefore, advised to learn how to use the OMR sheet through instruction videos on YouTube and other online resources.
7. Selected list will be declared on the College website.
8. Appearing in English subject is not compulsory for all, only students seeking admission to ENGLISH MAJOR have to attempt the subject.
9. Students seeking to change from Science to an Arts major shall appear in their preferred subject and may be called for an interview.
10. Applicants may choose to change from Science and Commerce streams to Arts stream. They should appear in their preferred subject/s.
11. PUC is a plastic-free campus, and no single-use water bottles are allowed on campus on the day of PUCET.



Mizoram University Regulation

1. ON EVALUATION

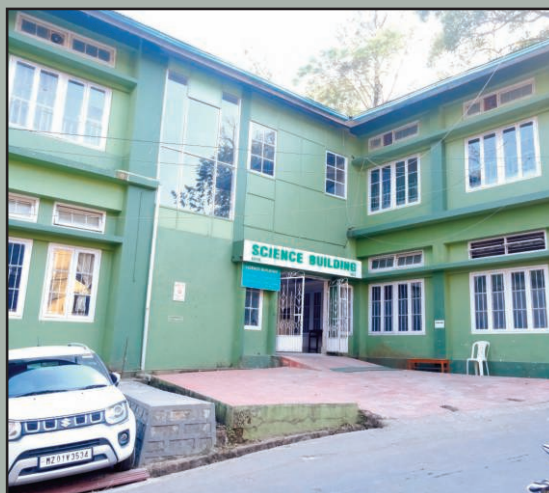
- 1.1 The system of evaluation is based on Internal Examination (IE) and End Semester Examinations (ESE).
- 1.2 Internal Examination (IE) of I Semester to IV Semester will be centrally conducted by the Exam Committee of the College through the Departments concerned.
- 1.3 Internal Examination (IE) of VII Semester & VIII Semester will be conducted by the Department concerned.
- 1.4 Internal Examination (IE) will be for a total of 25 marks.
- 1.5 **Retest:** The Principal in consultation with the department concerned, may or may not grant special permission for a retest on a case to case basis.
- 1.6 **Submission of marks:** The IE marks in whole number will be submitted by each department to the Principal before the commencement of ESE of that semester. The marks will be moderated by the Moderation Board and then submitted to the University.
- 1.7 **Practical Examinations:** All the practical exams (IE & End Semester) will be conducted by the concerned Department before the commencement of End Semester Exam (Theory)
- 1.8 Candidates are **not allowed** to bring mobile phones, digital diary and electronic devices inside the Examination Room.

3. ON ATTENDANCE

- 3.1 A minimum of seventy-five percent (75%) attendance shall be mandatory for a student to be eligible to appear in the End Semester Examination (ESE) of any registered Course.
- 3.2 In the event of a shortage of the prescribed 75% attendance in a Semester, the student shall not be permitted to proceed to or be promoted to the next corresponding Semester. Such a student shall be required to seek readmission to the same Semester in the subsequent Academic Year and shall be required to redo all the Courses of that Semester in order to fulfill the attendance requirement and become eligible to appear in the End Semester Examination. However, the total duration of study shall not exceed fourteen (14) consecutive Semesters. Further, such students shall not be considered for merit, ranking, or similar academic distinctions. (*Vide Mizoram University Notification. No. F.No. Ex/UG/1-43/21/ Dated the 24th February, 2026*)
- 3.3 Students are not entitled to any leave. In case of emergency and unavoidable circumstances, an application supported by relevant documents should be submitted to the Head of Department concerned.
- 3.4 Students are entitled to check their attendance with the respective teachers and clear their doubts, if any. No complaint or request for attendance will be entertained after compilation of final attendance.
- 3.5 Students representing the college, state and national level in sports and cocurricular activities may be given appropriate attendance by the Principal for the period of their engagement.

Code of Student Conduct

INTRODUCTION:

Pachhunga University college is committed to maintaining equality, fairness, and healthy environment for higher education. It accommodates a diverse community and sexes, and aims to provide inclusiveness, harmony and personal development by upholding the Fundamental Rights, Directive Principles and Fundamental Duties of India. This Code is ratified for the purposes of personal responsibility, peer accountability, safety, and social consciousness, among the students by the HOD committee.

1. RAGGING :

The University Grant Commission (UGC Regulation on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institution) 2009 defines ragging as, "Any act of Physical or mental abuse(Including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background." Ragging in campus is punishable by law and possible penalties range from

- (1) cancellation of enrolment,
- (2) debarring from examinations,
- (3) suspension for period of 1 to 4 semesters,
- (4) expulsion,
- (5) fine Ranging from Rs 25000 up to 1 lakh.

2. SEXUAL HARASSMENT:

UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of sexual Harassment of women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institution) Regulation, 2015 defines "sexual harassment" as "An unwanted conduct with sexual undertones if it occurs or which is persistent and which demeans, humiliates or creates

a hostile and intimidating environment or is calculated to induce submission by actual or threatened adverse consequences and includes any one or more or all of the following unwelcome acts or behaviour (Whether directly or by implication) namely:

- (a) any unwelcome physical, verbal or non-verbal conduct of sexual nature;
- (b) demand or request for sexual favours;
- (c) making sexually coloured remarks
- (d) physical contact and advances or
- (e) Showing pornography

Sexual harassment in the college is a legal crime and the penalty for a perpetrator student is expulsion.

3. ATTENDANCE:

UGC (Minimum Standards of Instruction for the Grant of the First Degree Through Formal Education) Regulations, 2003 imposes a minimum of 75% attendance out of the total number of classes students should attend in all subjects for eligibility to appear in the university examinations. Students deficit in attendance, i.e. <75% are barred from appearing in the end semester examinations. CCA attendance is recorded separately; absence in CCA will be fined with Rs 100 every time.

4. CONTINUOUS ASSESSMENT (CA):

There are three continuous assessments in a semester (First and second written tests and seminar/ assignment/project/class test) to which all students must compulsorily appear. If a student fails to appear in any of the test, he/she will have to meet the Principal and furnish an explanation. Under special conditions, the Principal in consultation with the department concerned can grant special permission for retest, if necessary.

5. SMOKING, MISUSE OF ALCOHOL AND NARCOTICS/INTOXICANTS:

The college strictly prohibits smoking, drinking liquor and indulgence in any intoxicants within the college campus. Violation shall bear penalties such as:

- (a) A fine of Rs 200 (For every offence) for smoking;
- (b) A fine of Rs 200 for drinking liquor or use of intoxicants as the first offence; second offence leads to expulsion.

6. MALPRACTICE IN EXAMS:

Malpractice in exams includes any sort of cheating, copying from notes or other students, use of illegal materials or gadgets, disrupting others and practice of any unfair mean. Students indulging in such malpractices shall be punished as per the Mizoram University Examinations Rules and Regulations. Punishment can result up to direct expulsion.

7. CLEANLINESS:

The college strives to sustain hygienic and sanitary campus. There should not be littering in the college campus. Students should discard wastes in the

proper dustbin provided. Toilets should be cleaned after use. Spitting in the classrooms, pavements, corridors and Toilet is strictly prohibited. Offenders are liable to a fine of Rs 100. Teachers, Administrative officers and security staff can impose the fine.

8. MOBILE PHONES:

Use of mobile phones and related electronic gadget is restricted in the classroom during class hours and examinations. If a student is found violating this restriction his/her mobile phone/ device will be confiscated. Confiscated phones can be claimed from the Principal only after seven days upon payment of Rs 200 as a fine.

9. LEAVE OF ABSENCE:

Students are not entitled for personal leave of absence from the classes. However, in case of emergencies and unavoidable circumstances, an application supported by relevant documents (Sicknessdoctor's letter; death related – funeral service Program) should be submitted to the Head of the department or teacher concerned, immediately on the

first day of resuming classes. No leave application should be entertained or considered if it is submitted after a lapse of even just one day.

10. **SOCIAL MEDIA AND CYBER CRIME:**
Social Media such as Facebook, Instagram, WhatsApp, Blogs Internet Forum, etc. can be useful means of communication and sharing information. But students are advised to abstain from posting derogatory remarks about the college and its fraternity that could incite adverse consequences. If a student is found guilty of such activity, Disciplinary Committee of the college will take appropriate actions.
11. **INTER- CLASS COMPETITION:**
The College does not allow any class to organize an inter-class competition of any kind not organised by the college or without the approval of the heads of the department or the principal. Violation of this rule shall result in the following disciplinary actions:
(a) Students of both parties will be subjected to college campus service.
(b) Students of both parties will lose one-day attendance.
12. **FUND – RAISER:**
Fund raising/ donations for service of the college and approved by the college authority is encouraged. However, Students individual or in groups, should not conduct fund raising activities on their own. Selling of any item, foodstuff, book and stationery material for educational purpose should be done only

with a written authorisation of the principal.

13. **VEHICLE PARKING AND TRAFFIC:**
Students should park their vehicles in the parking lot specified for them in an orderly fashion. Students should obey general traffics rules. Two wheelers can have only one pillion rider; and the driver should wear helmet. The speed limit inside the campus in 20 km/hr.
14. **COLLEGE T-SHIRT:**
The College has an official T-shirt. It is compulsory for students to wear the T-shirts on Monday, and on special occasion notified by the college authority. An offence carries a fine of Rs. 100.
15. **DISRUPTIVE BEHAVIOUR:**
Disruptive behaviour or any conduct of a student that disturb teachers or other students to the point of disrupting teaching, disciplinary, or functions of the college on or off campus. The penalty is expulsion
16. **PARTICIPATION IN LOCAL TOURNAMENT:**
Students are not allowed to participate in local tournaments of any form and manner during class hours. The College will not entertain any leave application furnished for such participation.
17. **CLASS PICNIC:**
The College does not endorse class picnic. Any consequences will be the sole responsibility of the students, and not the college.

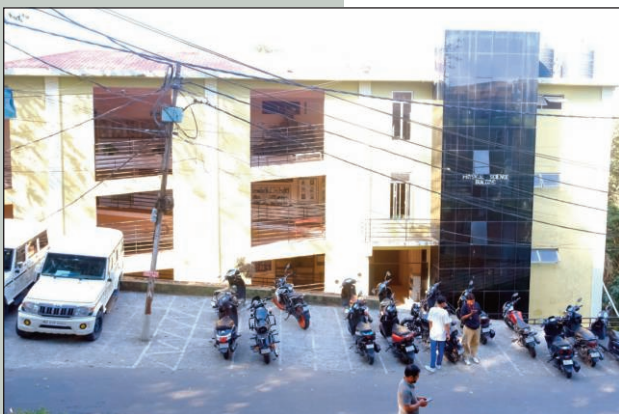

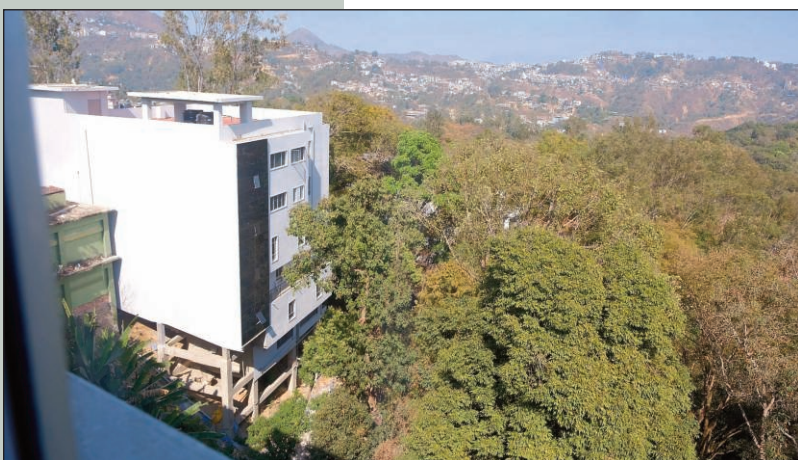
