

PUC NSS UNIT **Special Camping**





(Sakawrhmuituai Tlang and Muthi Village) Date: 20th April 2024

The NSS PUC Unit successfully organized special camping at Sihphir village, which is around 16 kilometres from Aizawl, and Muthi village, which is 12 kilometres from the centre of the city.

During these special camping, various activities were carried out, including:

- 1. Awareness campaign on drug abuse and tobacco control
- 2. Awareness campaign on Cancer
- 3. Cleanliness drive
- 4. Distribution of items for charity

On 20th April, cleanliness drive was conducted at Sakawrhmuituai Peak and Muthi Peak, both renowned tourist destinations in Sihphir and Muthi villages, respectively. Street campaigns were also held at several public places. Charity was distributed at three places - Hermon Children's Home, Ferrando Children's Home (Peace Home), and the Special Blind School. The items distributed were three bags of rice, three bags of potatoes, three bags of daal, fifteen kilogrammes of chicken, and other food items. A total of 56 volunteers (26 males and 30 females) along with 4 Programme Officers and 2 faculty members of the College took active part in this special camping.

REPORT

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On April 20th, 2024, the NSS PUC UNIT organized a One Day Campaign dedicated to spreading joy and support throughout the community. The initiative encompassed various impactful endeavors, including a cleanliness drive, visits to both an orphanage and a blind school, and the distribution of essential food supplies to support these institutions. Additionally, efforts were made to raise awareness among local residents about the importance of environmental conservation.

EVENT 1: Visit to the Orphanage

The campaign kicked off with a visit to a local orphanage, where members of the unit had the opportunity to interact with the children and extend their support.

During the visit, the NSS team distributed a sack of essential food items including rice, potatoes, soybean chunks, and pulses to the orphanage. This gesture aimed to provide basic sustenance to the children and contribute to their well-being.

Our Cleanliness Drive commenced at the Sakawrhmuituai Tourist Centre around 1 pm. Equipped with masks and gloves, we enthusiastically embarked on our mission to tidy up the area. Situated atop a hill, the panoramic view was truly enchanting, and the refreshing breeze lifted our spirits as we worked diligently to clear the litter. Amidst our efforts, we had the pleasure of encountering native medicinal plants indigenous to Mizoram, adding to the richness of our experience. Our endeavors were not only productive but also enjoyable, culminating in our return to the starting point around 2:30 pm.
